



**BC Provincial Development Snowboard Team
Internal Ranking Policy
Approved by the Board of Directors on September 6, 2010**

1. Background

The BC Provincial Development Snowboard Team Ranking Policy is designed to outline team ranking for the athletes selected to the Provincial Development Teams.

2. Policy

BC Snowboard Association (“BCSA”) attempts to be fair and equitable in all manner of business. This BC Provincial Development Snowboard Team Internal Ranking Policy is created to ensure that there is a fair practice of identifying athletes eligible for benefits within the BC Provincial Development Snowboard Team.

3. Ranking Date

The ranking date used for this Policy shall be the date of the initial announcement of BC Provincial Development Snowboard Team Selection (the “Ranking Date”).

4. Ranking Process

The athletes within the Vancouver Development Team and Okanagan Development Team will be ranked together.

The point scale to allocate points for the Stage of each athlete (“Stage Points”) (see CSC Pacific/PacificSport Carding Criteria and Assignment of Stage Points Policy) is as follows:

Stage 1	100 points
Stage 1A	80 points
Stage 2	60 points
Stage 3	50 points
Talent Pool	40 points

The overall points an athlete earns from each discipline in the BC Snowboard Provincial Series during the previous season (see 2010-2011 BC Snowboard Provincial Series Overall Points Calculation Policy) will be added together with his/her Stage Points to arrive at the athlete’s total ranking score (“Ranking Score”).

If an athlete does not participate in a discipline within the BC Snowboard Provincial Series, he/she will be assigned a score of zero (0) for that discipline within the Overall Series Points.

The athletes will then be ranked in order of their total Ranking Score by gender.

5. Tie Breaking

In the event of a tie of total Ranking Score, that tie will be broken by the best individual score used to arrive at the total points creating the tie.

6. Eligibility

In order to receive any benefits due to an athlete based on the BC Snowboard Provincial Development Team Internal Ranking, the athlete must be in good standing with BCSA.
